The Olympic torch origin and relay

OLYMPIC GAMES HERITAGE



BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Olympic Torch Relay always starts in Olympia, the location of the Ancient Olympic Games, to emphasise the link between the ancient and modern Games. The Modern Olympic Games started in 1896, but the ceremony of lighting the fire in Olympia and transporting the flame via a relay to the host city started in 1936. Each year, the host nation designs a course for the torch to travel prior to arriving at the host city. This course design is based on a key message selected by the nation, such as 'A relay of peace' in 1948 and 'A new world relay' in 1968.

Every Olympic Games, the torch is lit by the sun, to maintain the purity of the fire, and this purity represents the positive values associated with the Games. Early torches were fuelled by solid or liquid fuels including olive oil, but recent versions are generally a mix of butane and propane gases. In 1956, they used magnesium and aluminium flakes to create a giant sparkler. Unfortunately, this resulted in a burnt torchbearer. Over time, the design of the torches has changed to suit the fuel, as well as the design influence of the host city.

Page 16 – The flame from Olympia

The final torchbearer lights a cauldron which keeps burning until the end of the Games, when it is extinguished at the closing ceremony.


