

Remembrance Day

On 11 November each year at 11 am, we remember people who have fought in the world's wars. People wear poppies on this day as a symbol to show that they have not forgotten.

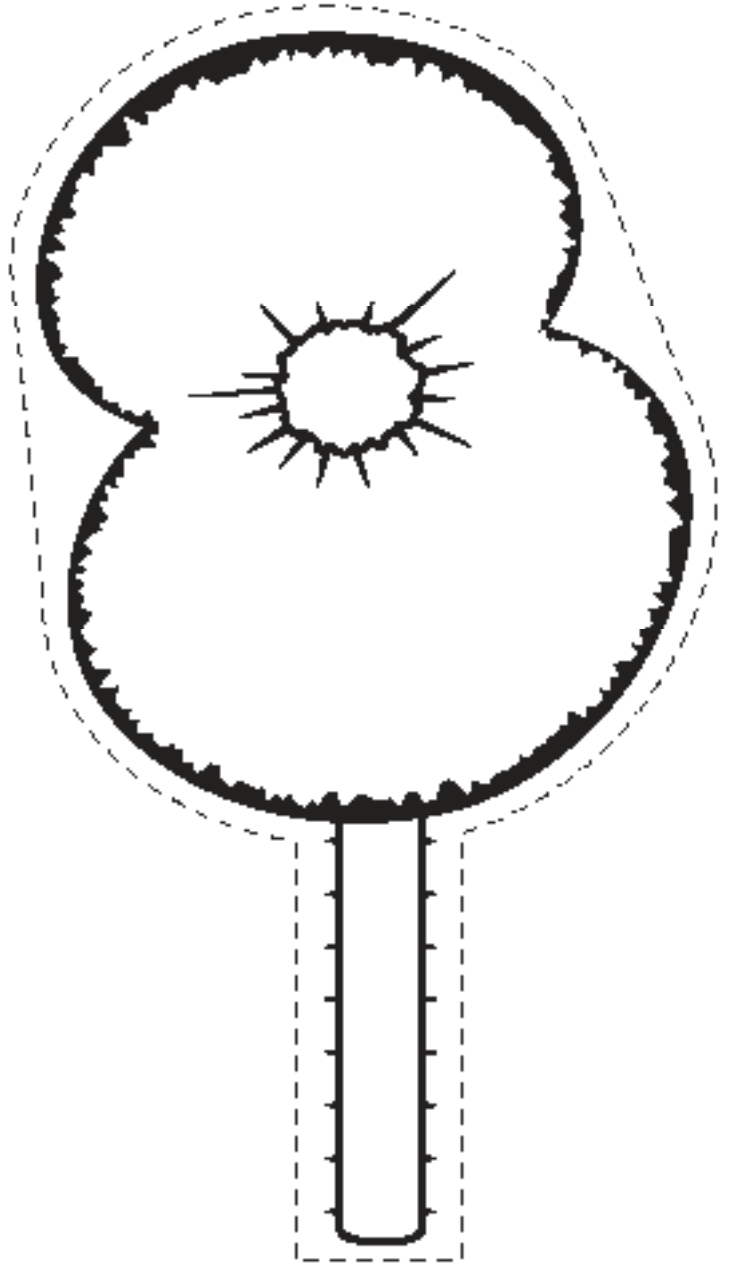
Use crepe paper to decorate your poppy.

You will need:

- red for the petals
- green for the stem
- black for the middle
- scissors
- glue
- a safety pin

Steps:

1. Cut or tear the paper into lots of small pieces and scrunch each piece into a small ball.
2. Glue the pieces onto the poppy.
3. When the glue has dried cut the poppy out. Ask an adult to help you stick your safety pin to the back.
4. Wear your poppy for Remembrance Day on 11 November.
